

## Case Study 3 – Richards



**Location:** Trowbridge, Wiltshire  
**Kitchen Style:** Gullwing Oak effect  
**Appliances:** Various  
**Worktops:** Laminate

Lynne and Donna had recently moved into their 3 year old detached house. Both have very modern tastes, so the traditional arched wood effect door on the kitchen they inherited, really wasn't to their liking. Following a recommendation from a friend, Lynne and Donna got in touch with us to help with their new kitchen.



After a brief telephone consultation we arranged a convenient date and time to meet. During our initial consultation Lynne and Donna fell in love with the Gullwing Oak from our sample kit and so it was used as the primary focus of the new design.

During the consultation stages, we highlighted the clients' principle requirements for the design. They asked us to create a peninsula protruding into the middle of the room, which incorporated ample storage but could also accommodate a space for someone to sit. We were able to create this using a small overhang on the back edge of the worktop, which we curved to make it more aesthetically pleasing. With the 3D model designed and agreed, we set about sourcing appliances that would help bring the kitchen to life.

Lynne and Donna had seen a double oven with a mirrored finish to the glazed doors that they particularly liked. They asked us to source the over for them and arrange for it to be installed, which of course, we did.

In keeping with the simple, modern theme that Lynne and Donna wanted, we chose a stainless steel and glass cooker hood, jet black laminate worktops, and the clients chose small rectangular gloss black tiles on the walls, to create a very unique finished look.

Once everything was agreed, sourced and ready to go, we arranged for the entire kitchen to be installed to our exact design and specifications. The result is a kitchen design that suits the needs of the clients and uses quality materials and appliances to create a unique feel
